I really don't like winter. At all.

It's cold. I often feel trapped inside the house... even though all I would have to do is put on my coat and go out. I know I am not really trapped, not actually stuck inside... but I feel like it. And the colder it is, the more I feel it. It is actually something of relief when enough snow falls that I have to go out and shovel... because then I do go out and stay out for awhile and actually do something physical!

But not today. Today it is cold and windy, and I feel like... like I am stuck. Trapped. Cut off from normal life. Anything but free.

It is a common feeling among us as people. Children growing into teenagers and young adults feel it as they bump up against the authority of their parents. They want to be independent and to make their own decisions and do what they want... but they are stuck. Trapped. Cut off from independent life. Anything but free.

Adults feel the same way facing the responsibility of adult life... work... bills... spouses... children. Some of these things we voluntarily take on ourselves, but others are the common burden of life. And we dream of vacations and retirement... of the freedom to do what we want, when we want.

And then, as we age, many of us really do become confined to home, especially in poor weather.

We long for something different than the various ways that this broken and sinful world oppresses us... and from how our sinful selfish selves see oppression in relationships and responsibilities that are great gifts.

In February, we get to see some signs of the coming end of winter oppression. On Groundhog Day, February 2, with some silly ceremony involving large rodents and shadows, we will remember that we are halfway through winter, at least according to the calendar. Then on Valentines Day we can turn our attention to the subject of love – those who love us, and those who we love.

They are signs of the times and a reminder of the coming spring, of warmth, and of renewed life.

May this article also be a mid-winter sign of the times. Remember that "It was for freedom that Christ has set us free, no longer to subject to a yoke of slavery." (Galatians 5: 1) True freedom is coming. Freedom from this broken and sinful world to instead live the Lord's own heaven. Freedom from sin and our selfish ways to live as children of God, freely living in God's grace and love. Freedom to love our Lord and serve our neighbors without compulsion, but in joy.

Our Lord Jesus has won our freedom. We are not trapped, even if we feel like it sometimes. And the figurative winter is ending. "Spring" is coming. Jesus is coming!
