Revival or Reformation?

For many years now the faithful church has watched as, despite our own efforts, our country and even large swaths of mainline Christianity have moved, not just more 'liberal'... but more and more blatantly anti traditional Christianity and more and more pro-self, pro-sin... farther and farther away from the need for salvation in Jesus Christ and in him alone.

In our own tradition the moment of watershed came 15 years ago when the ELCA voted to allow actively practicing homosexual individuals to be pastors... not just people who "leaned that way" or had homosexual tendencies. Out of that blatant disregard for God's clear Word in the Scriptures on that subject, but also on other subjects as well, our current denomination, NALC (North American Lutheran Church), with its dedication to the authority of the Scriptures on all matters of faith and life, was born.

Since then, other denominations have gone through the same struggle that we once did. Many other scripturally condemned practices have become normalized. And in once free places like Canada, Great Brittan, and even spaces in our own country, simply speaking God's Word honestly and holding to his truth has been labeled as "hate speech" and has become subject to both persecution and prosecution.

But something has changed.

It was already changing... I think. But the death, the martyrdom, of Charlie Kirk has accelerated it. It was already the case that a shocking percentage of young people have been heading back to church. But now the internet is flooded with testimonials of people heading back to church or going for the first time in decades. Bible sales are through the roof right now. Over 300,000 people attended Charlie Kirk's memorial service and one hundred million more... over a third of the country!... tuned in to television and streaming coverage of the service.

And they all heard the Good News of God in Jesus Christ proclaimed again... and again in the course of that service!

Something is going on! The Lord is at work! The Holy Spirit is calling, gathering, and enlightening people to salvation in Jesus Christ!

In much of the Christian world, the word for this is "revival". It is a good word! This is the better word for the portion of what is happening that involves people coming to faith in Jesus... either for the first time or returning to a long-forgotten faith. Sinners are being made alive in the death resurrection of Jesus Christ.

Our more Lutheran word would be "reformation". Reformation is better applied to the existing church that has become complacent... or hesitant... or tired... or mixed up with the world... the kinds of things that Jesus spoke to the seven churches in Revelation about. Reformation speaks of the church and the people of the church being renewed, returning to the Scriptures, being vitalized, being empowered and enlightened, for faithful living and faithful witness to our Lord Jesus Christ.

As we approach the celebration of the Reformation at the end of this month, may we be *reformed* in the power of the Holy Spirit so that we might be a place where those experiencing *revival* might find a home to worship and to live with and for our Lord!
